



What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65, officially known as the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 is a California law that applies to companies selling certain products in California. Proposition 65 requires warnings if a product contains any listed chemical present above very low levels OR the business has chosen to provide a warning comply based on its knowledge about the presence of a listed chemical without attempting to evaluate the level of exposure. Proposition 65 is not a product safety law, but rather a “right-to-know” law.

Eugene Fastener and Supply Company, out of an abundance of caution has elected to make the Proposition 65 warning applicable to all its products. This product may contain chemicals known to the State California to cause cancer and birth defects and reproductive harm.

There are over 800 chemicals on the Proposition 65 list, which is administered by California's Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA), a part of the California Environmental Protection Agency. The list includes naturally occurring and man-made chemicals. Proposition 65 warnings can be seen for a wide variety of everyday consumer products, including electronic equipment, and warnings can be seen posted throughout California in a variety of establishments such as buildings, hotels, restaurants, coffee shops, and stores.
